

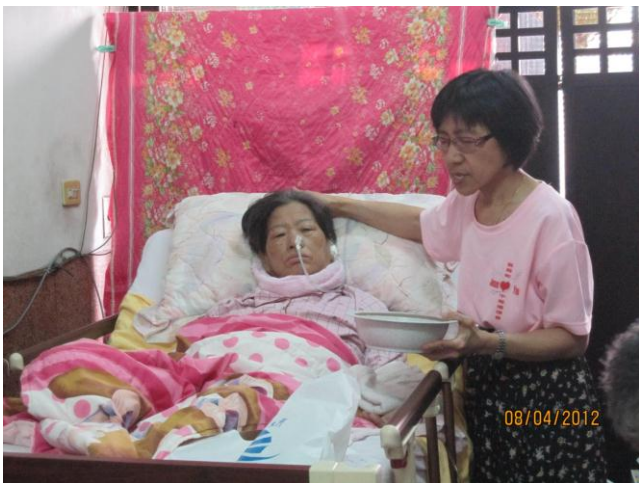
Dear prayer team,

Although it was a raining day, we had twenty people attend the discussion time with pastor Wen and his wife. And a special thank you to Megan who played piano in the

Because of language difficulty, we are not able to minister effectively to them. However, we can still love them and let them know we care about them.
